from Shipley, one from Bognor Regis, one from Midhurst, one from Fittleworth and the remainder from in or around Chichester.



Our trustees met on Monday 22nd July for their quarterly meeting at the Capitol Theatre Meeting Room in Horsham. Two new faces were introduced to the fold.
