Volunteer News



Mike Payne and Richard Pittman both stood down as Trustees at our September AGM having served their full term in office. Both were presented with commemorative plates by Crawley MP, Henry Smith, acknowledging their service to WSMS. We thank them both for all their time and effort over the year. Mike actually continues as book-keeper and will attend the office once a week to pay all our bills and keep the payroll running. Our new Treasurer, Allan Gee , from Worthing, will maintain a strategic overview of the charity finances.

Nick attended the Foundation for Social Improvement Conference in London on 16th September. This is a free event focusing on assisting small charities and was full of first rate speakers giving tips and advice.

Referrals

September proved to be a busy month with a total of **30** referrals, making it the equal busiest September on record. October by 24th, has shown 21 referrals.

Worthing Borough proved to be our busiest District, followed by Mid Sussex and Horsham.

Topics included noise, children, antisocial behaviour, family, intergenerational, debt, access (property) and trees.

At the last count we had **23** mediators shown on the board assigned to current or pending cases.

We are currently running on par with the referral figures reached at half way, last year. -137 referrals in the first 6 months of the financial year (exactly the figure we achieved at the same time last year).
