Horsham has been home to 51 giraffes in various guises over recent weeks! They were all part of a charity fundraising initiative organised by Horsham Rotary Club. Each giraffe was sponsored by a local business or organisation and individuals, local artists and schools decorated a bare giraffe to match the identity of the sponsor or the charity in question. A giraffe trail ensued, allowing people to hunt down the various hide-outs of the giraffes, record all their names, and enter a competition with a 42" TV as the top prize.

WSMS missed out on this very popular initiative but hope to salvage something from it by bidding for one of the giraffes, all of which are being auctioned off on eBay. Referrals

October ended with 25 referrals, which was less than the same month last year. That was, however, a totally record busting month with 39 referrals!

This year, November figures were similar to last with 22 referrals. Many of these were family related. We are keen to maintain our levels of community mediation referrals and would encourage all our statutory partners and Housing Associations, etc to keep us in the forefront of their minds when conflict situations are presented to them. We are meant to be an early intervention tool, where possible, so don't be afraid to bring us in when things are just 'bubbling'.

We are currently concerned about the low level of referrals in areas such as Crawley and Chichester. Please spread the word about our services. We are keen to maintain our levels of community mediation referrals — after all, they are what we came into being for in the first place. All our mediators are keen to keep their skills in practice.

Referrals can be made by email or phone. December will be slow as it always is traditionally. Let's make January a busy month for us!
