Noise Action Week falls between 19th & 24th May this year and the theme is how noise affects health & wellbeing.


WSMS will be displaying at the Horsham District Council offices to publicise the week. We had approached a number of public venues to host our display, including Swan Walk, Sainsburys in Horsham & Crawley and Asda in Crawley but drew a blank with all of them. This is further proof that corporates don't see our charity as attractive a proposition as the larger, higher profile ones and therein lies the rub.

We have a number 'Neighbour Noise' leaflets to hand out, which have been supplied by Environmental Protection UK, who sponsor the week. They are a charity in their own right.



Evidence against noise is clear:

- Last year housing think tank HACT found noise has a greater impact on people's happiness than vandalism or damp.
- Freedom of Information requests found noise is the number one complaint to our councils, with over 200,000 complaints lodged in just 9 months of last year



While a recent report on environmental groups found only 0.6% of their resource goes to tackling the local issues like noise, air and water pollution, noise is one of the indicators of <u>public health</u> now being used to inform government policy in England.

Reducing problem noise presents quite a burden on council tax payers – so preventing noise is in all our interests and more cost effective than answering complaints.

## Referrals

We had **31** referrals in April which was up from the **25** we took last April. Subjects included shared space, family, noise, intergenerational, fence, hedge and boundary. Horsham, Worthing and Arun featured well.

On 8th May, 14 mediators were shown on the board, allocated to current or pending cases.

By 19th May we had had 16 referral/enquiries to the office during the current month.




service works and suggesting the best ways of enticing tenants to the process of mediation.

- > We will be holding a one day Intergenerational Mediation Workshop for existing mediators on Monday 17th June. This will bring mediators up to speed on the relevant skills needed for this area of specialism.

Whilst we are not currently inundated with Intergenerational Mediation referrals, we do need a bigger pool of mediators capable of carrying out this work should things pick up.

#### **New Volunteer**


