## News

Funding - Pretty much all our income during December came from our own earned income, either through fundraising events or paid Family mediation work. We did receive one grant cheque from Pulborough Parish Council and we are very grateful to them for their continuing support.

> Referrals — December proved to be a quieter month, which is a normal trend for us. We took only 11 referrals with Noise Nuisance and Antisocial Behaviour being the main subjects. This was our lowest monthly total since June 2013.

**> Workplace Mediation** - We are currently undertaking a marketing drive to increase referrals for work related conflicts. We have a number of mediators trained in this speciality. Last year we helped a diverse group of organisations including a car dealership, a professional organisation, a Housing Association, several Parish Councils and a Health Centre.
