It also coincides with us being able to announce how the charity has faired over the last financial year in monetary terms.

Provisional figures suggest that we have achieved a small surplus for the year. This is in line with our achievement in the previous financial year.

Much of this year's success is down to the hard work of our Family and Workplace Mediators who have jointly achieved £21,167 in valuable income. Our sincere thanks goes to our Family Mediators, Robert Savage and Heather Foster plus all our Workplace Mediators, who are all volunteers. This money accounted for a quarter of our total income for the year.

Fundraising and donations amounted to just over £2,000.

Our thanks go to all our funders, benefactors, and of course all our volunteers, who have supported our work throughout the year. We look forward to another fruitful year in 2017/18.

Our total number of referrals for 2016/17 was **357** against 271 the previous year. This was a huge **32% increase**. Our busiest District was Horsham which accounted for 34.5% of our total workload. Self referred cases accounted for over 63% of our work. Referrals from the Police picked up this year following the introduction of the Resolution Centres.

- > Funding We have recently received some great news of our continued funding by the Police & Crime Commissioner, for 2017/18. A grant has been offered to the four Sussex Mediation Alliance partners which fund referrals received via Sussex Police. As disclosed on Page 1, direct Police referrals were on the increase over the last 12 months, rising from 33 to 43. Many more cases were referred indirectly, following signposting by Police Officers and Support Staff at Sussex Police.
- > Waitrose Community Matters— We recently collected a cheque in the sum of £345 from the Horsham branch of Waitrose following inclusion in the scheme back in December. The original cheque hade been lost (not by us) which resulted in the delay in it arriving in our lap.
